In pursuance of its powers under the above mentioned Act, the Brecon Beacons National Park Authority (hereinafter called 'the Local Planning Authority') hereby grants **PERMISSION** for the following development:

“Proposed demolition of existing detached Pool House and creation of new outdoor pool and ancillary accommodation, with associated works.” (Full Application) at Moor Park , Llanbedr, Crickhowell, NP8 ISS

subject to the following condition(s):

- 1 The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of five years from the date of this permission.
- 2 The development shall be carried out in all respects strictly in accordance with the approved plans (drawing no's MPP 01A (Site Location Plan), MPP 03A (Site Plan Proposed), MPP 04 A (General Plan Proposed), MPP 05 (Elevations Sections Proposed), MPP 06 (Gym/Changing Building Plans Proposed), MPP 07 (Gym/Changing Building Elevations/Sections Proposed), MPP 08 (Pergola Area Plan/Elevation Proposed), MPP-09 (External Lighting Proposed), 606-P-271 P (Foul/Waste water Management Plan Proposed), 606-P-272 P (Foul/Waste water Management equipment details), unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Local Planning Authority.
- 3 The biodiversity enhancement scheme as detailed in the ecological report dated 29th October 2020 shall be undertaken and/or installed prior to the first beneficial use of the development hereby approved, in accordance with the approved details and maintained thereafter. Following the installation of the approved scheme, a report confirming adequate installation shall be submitted to the Local Planning Authority.
- 4 The development (demolition and construction works) shall be implemented strictly in accordance with the Construction and Environmental Management Plan (CEMP) dated June 2021 and drawing no. MMP - 03A. No tools, machinery or materials associated with the development hereby approved shall be stored or used within 5 metres of any watercourse.
- 5 External lighting shall only be installed as shown on drawing number MPP-09. No additional external lighting shall be installed unless a revised external lighting plan is submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority. Any revised scheme shall avoid conflict with wildlife corridors and shall be implemented as approved.
- 6 The foul and wastewater drainage from the development hereby approved shall be installed and operated strictly in accordance with the submitted Drainage Strategy dated June 2021 and drawing numbers MPP - 03A and MMP - 04A.

- 7 Within three months of the commencement of the development, a landscaping plan that shall include use of native species, shall be agreed with the Local Planning Authority and shall be implemented in the first planting season following implementation of the development and maintained thereafter. The plan shall include details of the planting specifications - the species, sizes and planting densities - and a timetable for implementation and future management to ensure good establishment. Any plants, trees or shrubs that fail in the first five years after planting shall be replaced in the next available planting season on a like-for-like basis.
- 8 All works and ancillary operations which are audible at the site boundary shall be carried out only between the following hours:
 - o 0800 - 1800 hrs Monday to Friday
 - o 0800 - 1300 hrs Saturday
 - o At no time on Sunday and Bank Holidays
 Deliveries to and removal of plant, equipment, machinery and waste, including soil, from the site must also only take place within the permitted hours detailed above.

Reasons:

- 1 Required to be imposed by Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- 2 To ensure adherence to the approved plans in the interests of a satisfactory form of development.
- 3 To comply with Section 6 of Planning Policy Wales (2021), Technical Advice Note 5 and Policies SP3, 1, 3, 4, 6, 7, 10 and 12 of the adopted Local Development Plan for the BBNP o To comply with the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017 (as amended) and the Environment (Wales) Act 2016
- 4 To comply with Section 6 of Planning Policy Wales (2021), Technical Advice Note 5 and Policies SP3, 1, 3, 4, 6, 7, 10 and 12 of the adopted Local Development Plan for the BBNP o To comply with the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017 (as amended) and the Environment (Wales) Act 2016
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- 8 To protect the amenity of neighbouring residential properties.

Informative Notes:

- 1 All nesting birds, their nests, eggs and young are protected by law and it is an offence to:
 - o intentionally kill, injure or take any wild bird
 - o intentionally take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird whilst it is in use or being built
 - o intentionally take or destroy the egg of any wild bird
 - o intentionally (or recklessly) disturb any wild bird listed on Schedule I while it is nest building, or at a nest containing eggs or young, or disturb the dependent young of such a bird. The maximum penalty that can be imposed - in respect of a single bird, nest or egg - is a fine of up to 5,000 pounds, six months imprisonment or both.
 The applicant is therefore reminded that it is an offence under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended) to remove or work on any hedge, tree or building where that work involves the taking, damaging or destruction of any nest of any wild bird while the nest is in use or being built, (usually

between late February and late August). If a nest is discovered while work is being undertaken, all work must stop and advice sought from Natural Resources Wales

- 2 Warning: A European protected species (EPS) Licence is required for this development. This planning permission does not provide consent to undertake works that require an EPS licence. It is an offence to deliberately capture, kill or disturb EPS or to recklessly damage or destroy their breeding sites or resting places. If found guilty of any offences, you could be sent to prison for up to 6 months and/or receive an unlimited fine. NOTES TO APPLICANT

Appeals to the National Assembly for Wales

If you are aggrieved by the decision of your local planning authority to refuse permission for the proposed development or to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Welsh Government under Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

If you want to appeal, then you must do so within six months of the date of this notice for all forms of development, other than Householder Development, which is within twelve weeks of the date of this notice. You can do so using a form which you can get from the Planning Inspectorate at Crown Buildings, Cathays Park, Cardiff CF10 3NQ.

The Welsh Government can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal, but he will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.

The Welsh Government need not consider an appeal if it seems to him that the local planning authority could not have granted planning permission for the proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions it imposed, having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of the development order and to any directions given under the order.

In practice, the Welsh Government does not refuse to consider appeals solely because the local planning authority based its decision on a direction given by him.

Purchase Notices

If either the local planning authority or the Welsh Government refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he can neither put the land to a reasonable beneficial use in its existing state nor can he render the land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by the carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted.

In these circumstances, the owner may serve a purchase notice on the local planning authority in whose area the land is situated. This notice will require the local planning authority to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

Compensation

In certain circumstances compensation may be claimed from the local planning authority if permission is refused or granted subject to conditions by the Welsh Government on appeal or on reference of the application to him.

These circumstances are set out in Sections 114 and related provisions of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

Notes

Failure to adhere to the details of the approved proposals for development contained in this application, or to comply with any conditions or limitations subject to which this permission was granted, will constitute a breach of planning control. This may result in the local planning authority serving an enforcement notice requiring the breach to be remedied under Section 172 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

3. Planning:

3.1 Applications: to resolve responses to consultations received from BBNPA:

3.2 Decisions: none received.

4. County Council Report: County Councillor Morris reported:

- Llanbedr School: Powys County Council (PCC) has approved the closure of Llanbedr School despite not undertaking an education review and there being very little evidence to support the school's closure. It is highly likely this will now proceed to a judicial review.

The high school and other primary schools are concerned over the way PCC is approaching the delivery of education. There are rumours it plans to turn the high school site into an all through school of 750/800 pupils and restrict access from adjoining areas (the high school alone currently has some 1,000 pupils). Support will be required from the whole community within the next months to challenge PCC and the direction of education.

- Llanfoist Waste Centre – there is no change to the current arrangement. If people in Powys wish to use this depot they can provided they pay the commercial rate. There is no financial agreement between Monmouthshire and Powys to facilitate free access to the depot.

- Flooding – PCC is currently unblocking drains in the area. Cty Cllr Morris has taken delivery of sandbags for emergency use and intends speaking to Flood Wardens to determine where they should be distributed.

The order of the agenda was amended – Item 8 (i) was discussed next.

8. Llanbedr School: (i) to discuss Powys County Council's Consultation Report and (ii) consider request by Dolau School to object to its closure

Cllr Lusted has met with the solicitor and barrister acting for Llanbedr School. The school has two options. It can either proceed to a judicial review or, as it is a voluntary aided faith school, get it called in by Welsh Ministers, although this could delay the process. Whilst the legal team are confident legal arguments will prove successful in a judicial review they are currently considering how best to proceed. A definitive decision will be taken in the next few days.

When the statutory notice is issued there will be a 28 day objection period. At this stage the community council can provide a statement to demonstrate how the school's closure will affect the community. It was agreed to hold a meeting following publication of this notice.

7. Llangenny Water Fountain: to receive up-date

Welsh Water has provided an up-dated quotation. The cost for connecting to mains water has increased to £2,364.20. The Clerk will liaise with Cllr Sharman regarding the grant application.

8. Llanbedr School: (i) to discuss Powys County Council's Consultation Report and (ii) consider request by Dolau School to object to its closure

Cllr Lusted reported Dolau School has been very supportive Llanbedr School with both schools sharing information over the last few months. It was agreed to submit a letter of support for rural schools. Cllr Lusted to draft.

9. Llanbedr Nature Garden: to receive up-date and agree maintenance

Cllr Morris thanked Cllr Fairclough for organising the meeting with a former BBNPA warden, who agreed with the council's proposals for the ground, ie the grass should be cut now and the woodchip path renewed. It was suggested a larger hibernation space is provided for hedgehogs and wildlife. A meeting has been arranged for Thursday, 18th November with Wales & West Housing Association to discuss maintenance.

10. Speeding in Glangrwyney: to discuss ways of reducing speed

The request for electronic speed signs and a reduction in speed limit to 50mph has been passed to Welsh Government for response. Members questioned why Welsh Government is unwilling to provide a camera in Glangrwyney when other trunk roads have such signage? It was agreed to discuss this further with PCSO Dunne when he attends the December meeting.

11. Welsh Government Consultation: Local taxes for second homes and self-catering accommodation: to agree response as circulated

Cllr Fairclough prepared a draft response for consideration, referring members to a newspaper article which highlighted how second homes and holiday lets are pricing local people out of the housing market, and questioned why such businesses are subject to small business rate relief. Following discussion it was agreed Cllr Fairclough will prepare a final draft for approval prior to submission.

12. Climate and Ecological Emergency (CEE) Bill: to consider support

Cllr Fairclough proposed the council resolve to support this bill. This was seconded by Cllr Bowker. The clerk to draft a response.

RESOLVED to: support the bill.

13. Military Training in The Vale of Grwyney: to receive and decide how to progress complaints regarding military exercises in Grwyne Fawr.

The military exercises undertaken in Grwyne Fawr have culminated in several complaints of speed and noise disturbance from residents. Following discussion it was agreed to write to the organisers of the Cambrian Challenge and Operation Longreach (Sandhurst) to request notice of future training exercises and to ask them to be considerate of residents, by reducing both speed and noise when undertaking manoeuvres in the valley.

- 3. Llanbedr Church in Wales School: to discuss and agree a response to the decision taken by Powys County Council to close Llanbedr Church in Wales School on the 31st August 2022**

The school was reported to be thriving with numbers currently nearing capacity. It appears inconceivable Powys County Council (PCC) is considering closing a school with such a proven record of success, particularly concerning as it appears to be basing this decision on incorrect information.

Following discussion it was agreed the council write to object to the closure of Llanbedr School emphasising the effect the school's closure will have on the community.
