3. Prior to their installation, Details of the French door to a minimum scale of 1:10 including elevations, vertical and horizontal sections shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the Local Planning Authority prior to installation.
4. New stonework for the extension shall be of rubble construction. It shall match the existing in type, coursing, colour, and size, and shall be laid with a mortar which is slightly weaker than the stone.
5. The extension shall be roofed in stone tiles to match the existing stone tiles on the south range in stone type, coursing, colour, and thickness.
6. The biodiversity enhancement scheme as shown on *"3895-03 Proposed Elevations including Ecological Enhancements"* received 13th September 2023 shall be undertaken and/or installed prior to the first beneficial use of the development hereby approved, in accordance with the approved details and maintained thereafter. To comply with the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017 (as amended) and the Environment (Wales) Act 2016.

Informative Notes:

1. All nesting birds, their nests, eggs and young are protected by law and it is an offence to:
 - intentionally kill, injure or take any wild bird
 - intentionally take, damage or destroy the nest of any wild bird whilst it is in use or being built
 - intentionally take or destroy the egg of any wild bird

- intentionally (or recklessly) disturb any wild bird listed on Schedule 1 while it is nest building, or at a nest containing eggs or young, or disturb the dependent young of such a bird.

The maximum penalty that can be imposed - in respect of a single bird, nest or egg - is a fine of up to 5,000 pounds, six months imprisonment or both.

The applicant is therefore reminded that it is an offence under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended) to remove or work on any hedge, tree or building where that work involves the taking, damaging or destruction of any nest of any wild bird while the nest is in use or being built, (usually between late February and late August). If a nest is discovered while work is being undertaken, all work must stop and advice sought from Natural Resources Wales.

2. Work should halt immediately and Natural Resources Wales (NRW) contacted for advice in the event that protected species are discovered during the course of the development. To proceed without seeking the advice of NRW may result in an offence under the Conservation of Habitats and Species Regulations 2017 (as amended) and/or the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (as amended) being committed. Community and Town Councils - Councillor Allowances - Homeworking arrangements and consumables

The Panel has received the following guidance from HMRC, regarding the treatment of tax on councillor allowances:

[Section 316A of the Income Tax \(Earnings and Pensions\) Act 2003](#) states no liability to income tax arises in respect of a payment an employer makes to an employee in respect of reasonable additional household expenses which the employee incurs in carrying out duties of the employment at home under homeworking arrangements.

The exemption only applies to the £156 payment made under the Determination of the Independent Remuneration Panel. It does not exempt any additional household expenses that a Councillor may seek to claim.

The following two conditions must apply to the exemption:

1. The first provision is that there must be a formal arrangement between the individual councillor and Community and Town Council.
2. Secondly, each individual councillor must declare they work from home regularly under these arrangements. This arrangement should be set out and a template letter is attached for your use.


The IRP has determined that Councils must either pay their members £52 a year for the cost of office consumables required to carry out their role, or alternatively Councils must enable members to claim full reimbursement for the cost of their office consumables.

The Panel has also received confirmation from HMRC that an exemption may also be applied (from 5/4/2023) to the flat rate consumables payment. **Where a Council has taken the decision to pay a flat rate reimbursement of £52, then this amount is considered exempt from PAYE arrangements.**

It is advised that you send a short note outlining this to each Councillor and a template letter is attached. Clerks should also be mindful of any changes of circumstances, for example, when a Councillor ceases working from home, or otherwise are no longer eligible, which would mean these payments no longer fall within the exemptions.

Dear Councillor

In carrying out your duties as a Community and Town councillor, the Independent Remuneration Panel for Wales (IRP) recognises that there will be a requirement for you to work from home on a regular basis. In these circumstances, the Community and Town Council will provide a standard contribution to the costs incurred of £156 per annum (or £3 per week). This arrangement falls within the HMRC definition of "homeworking" arrangements and therefore will be exempt from PAYE.

The IRP has determined that Councils must either pay their members £52 a year for the cost of office consumables required to carry out their role, or alternatively Councils must enable members to claim full reimbursement for the cost of their office consumables. Where a Council has taken the decision to pay a flat rate reimbursement of £52, then this amount is considered exempt from PAYE arrangements.

Subject: Re: Mynydd Du Forest: potential felling of roadside beeches

Dear Maria,

Thank you for your email.

As residents of the Grwyne Fawr Valley and citizens concerned for the environment in this climate emergency, we treasure the biodiversity and amenity of this place. The thousands of people who visit from around the world each year doubtless share this view.

We are dismayed that a decision to destroy a significant, highly visible stretch of mature broadleaf woodland seems to have been taken by Natural Resources Wales (NRW) without due regard to its own duties and responsibilities under legislation regarding biodiversity and amenity. We are also very dismayed about recent instances of small-scale felling of large roadside trees that give rise to justifiable concern about incremental loss of mature trees over time.

For your information, the area of plantation conifer and roadside beech due to be felled is shown in purple on the Forest Management Systems Map contained in NRW's Forest Resource Plan (reviewed in 2021), which can be found at [Natural Resources Wales / Mynydd Du Forest resource plan](#). Our concern is for the beeches, as non-plantation trees.

We hope that the Community Council will call on NRW to reverse its decision to fell the beeches, and instead revert to its previous longstanding practice of using sensitive management to maintain roadside trees with the overall aim of maintaining as much mature beech - and oak - as possible.

In so doing we ask the Council to remind NRW of its statutory responsibilities as a public body, including:

- 1) To observe its responsibilities towards all UK and local Biodiversity Action Plan (BAP) species. For your information, a UK Red List species is known to breed in this very stretch of broadleaf woodland: the wood warbler, considered a conservation priority (BAP) species, which requires mature deciduous woodland on a steep slope as its breeding habitat.
- 2) To carry out its business with due regard to its responsibilities under the UK National Parks legislation as set out in the Environment Act 1995.

We also ask the Council to seek assurance that careful consideration will be given in future to the removal of any more large roadside trees, with a view to preserving as many of these as possible, and to putting in place appropriate future management for those that remain. We appreciate that in order to keep a road open and safe, trees must be subject to some judicious cutting, and it may even be necessary to fell a small number of them where cutting would not be effective (however, replacement trees should always be planted.)

I confirm here that we agree to the terms of the CC's privacy policy, and we look forward to hearing from you.
