The training emphasised the importance of referring to policies when responding to planning applications. Material considerations must be considered. Emotional responses do not work.

The BBNPA consultation exercises referred to earlier [Page 1248 3.2 (ii)] should clarify procedures.

- **8. BBNPA Draft Rights of Way Improvement Plan**: The Draft Rights of Way Improvement Plan is now out for consultation. Comments are invited by 17<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Members were asked to look at the response form circulated previously and forward comments to the Clerk for submission. The Clerk will ask Cllr Sharman if he wishes to comment.
- 9. Llanbedr Nature Garden Opening Event: In response to the query as to whether the Council can plant a dwarf cherry tree (or similar) in the nature garden WWHA confirm they will accept additional planting provided neighbours and drainage runs are considered and the garden remains a nature garden supporting local wildlife.

The Clerk has asked WWHA to consider contributing towards the cost of the opening event and is currently awaiting a decision. It was suggested WWHA sponsor refreshments and/or a gift for the children participating in the signage competition. Kirsty Williams AM will be invited to open the event. The Clerk will ascertain her availability in May before setting a date.

Llanbedr School will be asked to design three signs. One to welcome people to the nature garden, one asking owners to pick up after their dogs and one asking people not to litter. Powys CC will be asked to provide a bin by the allotments to deter littering.

Cllr Alford has collected the lottery funded benches and offered to install one bench in the nature garden – he will meet with Cllr Morris to agree positioning. (*Cllr Alford will store the second bench until a suitable site has been agreed*).

**10. Five Councils Meeting**: Crickhowell Civic Society has been invited to speak however is in the process of arranging a meeting with the Police Commissioner and therefore considers it more effective for representatives of the Five Councils to attend this and report back to their councils - Cllrs Christy and Bowker offered to represent the Vale of Grwyney CC.

Agenda items for the Five Councils have been received from Llangattock CC and Crickhowell TC. Llangynidr CC will respond following its February meeting. PC Lee Garret and PCSO Dunne will give a policing up-date. The Clerk will draft an agenda and circulate for approval.

- **13. Community Projects:** It was suggested residents are asked to submit ideas for projects to enhance their community and RESOLVED to allocate £1,000 towards this.

- **16. Highways**: Cllrs Morris, Alford. Sharman and the Clerk met with PCC officers to discuss signage at the Craig-y-bwla junction to deter MOD vehicles using the road to Partrishow. PCC agreed to install a sign stating the road was not suitable for lorries, together with a sign to the right directing traffic to Grwyne Fawr, suggesting Monmouthshire CC is asked to install a continuity sign at the 3 way junction by Brynawel to direct drivers to Five Ways. If MCC decline PCC has designed a sign which could be erected just before the bridge on the Powys side of the border.

Cllr Alford reported the hedge on the road to Partrishow church needs cutting (reported previously).

White lines urgently need re-painting by the three corner wood in Llanbedr – an accident occurred recently at this junction when a cyclist failed to stop and hit a vehicle.

Members agreed to suspend standing orders at 9:30pm to allow time for the business of the meeting to be continued.
