Prior to the installation of the passing bay and in accordance with the following planting specifications, the replacement hedgerow shall be implemented and completed in the first available planting season. Any plants, trees or shrubs that fail in the first five years after planting shall be replaced in the next

available planting season on a like-for-like basis. A stock-proof fence shall be erected to the boundary of the planting to prevent damage by grazing animals. The planting specifications shall be as follows unless otherwise agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority:

HEDGEROW PLANTING SPECIFICATION

Hedging plants are to be 60-80 cm high, 1+1, bare-root, healthy and vigorous transplants to be planted in a double staggered row, 450mm apart, with 5 plants per linear metre.

All transplants shall be protected with a 400mm high plastic spiral rabbit guard supported by a 750mm stake or cane. Stock proof fencing should be erected to protect hedging from grazing as required.

The hedge is to be maintained for a period of 5 years following planting, ensuring adequate watering and fertilising is carried out to ensure good establishment and that all dead, diseased or damaged plants are replaced annually where required.

3.2 Decisions/Other: to receive/discuss decisions and other planning matters:

Application 22/21480/FUL: full planning permission for the demolition of existing bungalow and replacement new dwelling. Ty Celyn, Bellfountain Road, Llangenny has been permitted.

- 4. County Council Report to receive and discuss general Powys County Council Matters: Cllr Beecham reported:
 - Daniel Relf (PCC Highways) has agreed to meet Cllr Beecham and Councillors and travel around the Vale to identify repairs required. The highways team are currently undertaking a number of safety inspections and the majority of maintenance defects should be resolved before the meeting (16th June 2023).
 - Structural maintenance work is planned for Bont Road/Hermitage Road however as this
 requires capital funding it will not be resolved this year. Temporary repairs will be
 undertaken to make the road safe. Work to repair the stonework and coping stones on
 Llangenny Bridge will be carried out as soon as possible. PCC is due to undertake
 repairs to the trunk road through Glangrwyney.

- Cllr Beecham has emailed Cllr Simon Howarth and Cllr Mary Ann Brocklesby suggesting meeting to discuss ways of improving road safety around the iron bridge in Glangrwyney. Once a date has been arranged Cllr Beecham will inform members. The weight limit sign was noted to have disappeared from the bridge.
- Cllr Beecham and Cllr Lusted met Cllr Charlton to discuss what will happen with the site following the closure of Llanbedr School. Cllr Charlton has been informed the church has not made a decision however assured her they wish to support the community.
- Increased parking charges and removal of the one hour parking charge in Crickhowell has met opposition.

5. Clerk's Report: information from the minutes/up-date on progress

- an application has been made to change the bank mandate.
- the original deed relating to the land in Glangrwyney will be forwarded once registered.
- Councillors who have not signed the communication expense form were asked to complete and return to the Clerk.

6. Queen Platinum Jubilee Celebrations: to receive up-date

Following discussion it was agreed the tree plaques should be made from stainless steel and fixed onto galvanised angle irons. Cllr Morris has planted six of the trees. The Clerk with get another quote for the plaques. The web page relating to the Jubilee Walk is under development – any photos of the Queen/Royal Family, particularly with local residents, should be sent to the Clerk for use in illustrating the Queen's 70 year reign.

8. Parking in Glangrwyney: to discuss ways of combating parking problems in the village

Due to a variety of reasons (increased trade/cars/holiday homes) parking in Glangrwyney has become more problematic. Vehicles are parking on the road causing congestion and safety concerns. Whilst residents can use the hall car park this is only if it is not needed by hall users. It is questioned whether land adjacent to the hall could be purchased/leased for use as residents parking? Cllr Beecham suggested Daniel Relf is shown the difficulties when they meet. Photographic evidence needs to be gathered to demonstrate the problem.
